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THERAPEUTIC DAY SCHOOL

The Therapeutic Day School provides a unique learning experience for students who may have difficulties learning in traditional school settings. The Day School offers a trauma-informed approach with students in classrooms with low teacher to student ratios. Students are able to develop positive relationships with caring staff members—thereby increasing their abilities to grow academically, socially and emotionally in a safe and supportive educational environment.



OUR MODEL INCLUDES:

- Individual and small group teaching
- Weekly individual and group counseling sessions
- In-home family counseling
- Weekly therapeutic groups focused on a variety of social-emotional, health and life-skill domains

ELIGIBILITY:

- Students ages 8–18
- Students with learning, emotional or behavioral disabilities
- Students who require a safe, structured and therapeutic academic environment as identified in their individualized education plan (IEP)

Many of the youth we serve are involved in the legal system, use alcohol or drugs, struggle to fit in with their peers, and have trouble with authority figures. Many are dealing with significant family challenges such as divorce or the death of a parent and cannot manage their emotions or behavior without significant support.

We help our students set goals—and keep them. Most students are ready to begin transitioning to a less restrictive academic setting within two semesters.

One Hope United works closely with the referring districts to assess progress and determine the best transitional plan for each student. Parents and educational staff are welcome to observe their child or student at any time.
